ADVOCATING CHANGE: LEARN ABOUT HOW TO FIGHT SEXUAL TRAFFICKING VIA SOCIAL MEDIA AND SENIOR EXPLOITATION

AAUW-Lake Geneva Branch has partnered with Matheson Memorial Public Library to bring you this program through the generous support of Join the Movement Events (JTME). JTME is a 501c3 Non-Profit with the mission of bringing awareness and education to our local communities while providing advocacy assistance to victims of trafficking and the related crimes of domestic and sexual violence. Their presentation on Tuesday, November 14th at 6:30 PM will discuss social media's role in human trafficking and how you keep yourself and your loved ones safe online. They will also discuss senior exploitation and how to recognize the signs of abuse.

This presentation will be given by Dawn Heath-Fiedler, the Founder and President of JTME. Dawn's passion is threefold: for her husband and family, her relationship with God and for Join Movement Events, Inc. (JTME), educating our local communities, what human trafficking is and how to protect their neighborhoods and most especially our youth. She became aware of this great need for Wisconsin at her Rotary District conference several years ago. Since that time Dawn has attended the WCASA (Wisconsin Coalition Against Sexual Assault) Sexual Assault Victim Advocacy School, trainings with the FBI, DOJ, ICAC, WDOJ, Children's Hospital, Amber Alert and NCJCT, Truckers Against Trafficking and local organizations.
