





AAUW is happy to once again host Great Decisions offered by the Foreign Policy Association. Classes are open to AAUW members, as well as members in the Geneva Lake community. Weekly meetings take place for 8 weeks from the first week in February to the last week in March.

How it Works

Each week prior to class, you read an article from the Great Decisions 2025 "book". When we meet, we watch and discuss a video. (Both articles and videos are written and produced by leading scholars and The Foreign Policy Association.)

You can choose to participate in an evening class (6 - 8 pm) or a morning class (9-11 am). The evening class usually has had around 10-12 participants, while the morning session has anywhere between 15-22. Last year both groups met at the Williams Bay Barrett Memorial Library.


Our discussion of *The Covenant of Water* by Abraham Verghese will be led by Sharna Ahern.
