President's Message

As we reflect during the Thanksgiving weekend and on this cold and blustery December 1st, I want to express my gratitude for being a part of such a diverse and intelligent group of women as are in our local AAUW branch.

First, thank the policy group for providing civility links in this month's Branch Briefs. Second, and more importantly, I want to congratulate each of us that within this group, no matter what our individual opinions, we always conduct collective discourses using attentive listening skills to create civil and respectful conversations.

I contacted each new member and met with those whose schedules permitted. During our one-on-one meet & greets, I asked them why they joined AAUW, what their goals were in doing so, and how our branch could support them. All stated they believed in the AAUW mission, but their goal was to form friendships with other educated women. They wished to participate in more casual social occasions rather than scheduled programming and wanted to receive creative methods to support and mentor each other. All felt positive about setting up a telegram text system wherein if one member wanted to go to, e.g., an art show, they could shoot out a text to the telegram group to see if anyone wanted to join them. I spoke to the Membership Committee about this and will do so at January's Board meeting.

I did this because we need new people to fill leadership vacancies. People will only do this if they feel directly connected to a group. Missions are great for visioning but seldom satisfy individual needs. With some creative socializing, I hope we can create the intimate connections needed to produce passionate AAUW mission advocates willing to educate, support, and mentor all women.

The force needed to conduct successful fundraising for our STEM Scholarship program. But fundraising is changing. Galas and events cost a lot in time and money for their, at best, 50% return. Many groups are turning to more creative, less labor-intensive activities. To assist our group and others in Walworth County who are also facing this challenge, our branch will sponsor a round table program conducted by the Gateway Foundation next year, inviting all area groups interested to attend.

Speaking of next year and STEM, we will conduct our first Zoom program in February. The purpose is for Val and Shelia to present the STEM process and application to our membership and then address any questions each of you may have.

And finally, I want to mention our end-of-year Holiday Party at Big Foot Country Club! The reservation form is in this month's Branch Briefs. Please fill it out and send it to Carla if you need to. There will be an excellent dinner, entertainment, songs, and three raffle baskets. They are from the State Convention filled with Fontana Centennial, Geneva Lake Conservancy, Elkhorn Chamber, and other goodies.


Welcome back to December Issue #12!


