Your Vote Matters on April 1 – Be Informed!

The American Association of University Women (AAUW) is a nonpartisan organization dedicated to advancing gender equity through research, education, and advocacy. AAUW Wisconsin urges citizens to be informed and vote on April 1, 2025.

Key issues on the ballot:

1. Voter ID Constitutional Amendment

Wisconsin already has one of the most restrictive voter ID laws in the nation. Research shows these laws disproportionately disenfranchise voters. A proposed amendment seeks to make this law permanent, preventing future courts from ruling against it. AAUW urges a NO vote.

2. Wisconsin Supreme Court Election – Crawford vs. Schimel

This race will shape Wisconsin's future on issues such as fair maps, reproductive rights, labor laws, and environmental regulations. Brad Schimel has opposed abortion rights, supported gerrymandered maps, and received major funding from an Elon Musk-backed group. Susan Crawford supports fair maps, reproductive rights, and labor protections.

3. State Superintendent Race - Kinser vs. Underly

Dr. Jill Underly is a lifelong public education advocate, opposing the use of taxpayer dollars for private schools. Brittany Kinser supports school privatization. AAUW stands for strong public education.

4. There are local elections for school boards, referendums, village boards Check out your local elections and be informed about the candidates and issues. Be sure you are voting for candidates that reflect your views!

The future of Wisconsin is on the ballot. Be informed. Vote April 1.
